INTRODUCTION

This year the Singapore Australian Football Club (SAFC) has been nominated to host the 9th annual Asian championships in Singapore. This will be the second time Singapore has held the Asian Championships since the inaugural event in 2000. Singapore hosted the 2002 Asian Championships at Sentosa. This year poses to be the great Championships with a total of 10 teams coming from Bali, China Reds, Hanoi, Hong Kong, Jakarta, Laosn, Malaysia and Singapore, Thailand Tigers, Vietnam and the United Arab Emirates.

The 2008 Asian Championships will be played at the prestigious Singapore Polo Club, which boasts two superb playing surfaces in Asia. The day consists of each team playing 4 preliminary games followed by Semi Finals and the Grand Final.

For the first time ever an Under 16 Junior Asian Championships will held concurrently with the Senior Tournament.

The Butcher will be running a Gourmet Australian BBQ for players, spectators & families.

San Miguel will be ensuring that spectators are adequately hydrated throughout the day.

We have created the format on the basis of feedback from teams, experience at other Asian Championships and the spirit of how we would like to run the tournament.

- Ensure that all visiting teams get to play 4 games of football. If you have travelled so far and trained all season then players should get to play good amount of football.
- If teams lose one game they still have a chance to qualify for the semi-finals and their season/day will not be dependent on the result of one game.
- Provide a showcase of Asian Football on the main ground of the Championships with the Semi Finals, Under 16 Championship, Auskick Carnival and Asian Championships Grand Final.
- Recognise and reward last year's grand finalists with a seeding in this year's championships
- Ensure that all squad members participate and enjoy the championships and are not excluded.

We are cognisant that for the Grand Finalists that there will be a lot of football played and will be measures to help teams with this

- Hydration Strategy:
 - Champion Nutrition Revenge Sports Drink is the Official Sports Drink of the Asian Champs and will be provided in volume to all teams, with each team getting their own staffed hydration station.

- Water will be provided to all teams and players
 - Red Bull is the Official Energy Drink of the Championships and will available at the ground to all players and spectators.
 - **Recuperation Breaks**
 - Between the preliminary games and the semi finals there will be Auskick Carnival and Hurling Demonstration ensuring a minimum 60min break before the semi finals.
 - The Under 16 Asian Championships Grand Final will take place immediately after the semi finals ensuring a 40minute break between the Semi's and Grand Final.
1. **Championship Format**
- a. **Preliminary Rounds**
 - i. The 10 Teams will be randomly drawn into 2 Groups of 5 teams
 - ii. Last year's Grand Finalists (Bali & Hong Kong) will be drawn into separate groups
 - iii. The rest of teams will be allocated randomly
 - iv. The draw will take place "Live" on ESPN's Football Crazy Show which is show live out across Asia and the Middle East on the 28th of August*
 - a. Teams will be advised of the broadcast schedule in advance and receive a copy of draw via email on Friday August 29th.
 - v. A Round Robin Tournament will be played in each group
 - vi. Games shall be consist of 12min Halves, with a 4 minute interval
 - vii. Teams will be allocated Four Points for a win, 2 points for a draw, none for a loss
 - viii. In the event teams are tied on points they are ranked using the following tie-breaks.
 - 1. For and against
 - 2. Head-Head (if required)
 - ix. The top two teams from each group go to through to the semi finals
 - b. **Finals**
 - i. **Semi Finals**
 - 1. Top Team Group A plays Second Team from Group B
 - 2. Top Team Group B plays Second Team from Group A
 - 3. The Semi Finals will be played on the main pitch consecutively
 - 4. The order of play of the semi finals will be decided by a toss of a coin by the captains of the top teams in Group A & B.
 - 5. Games shall consist of 15minute halves with a 5 minute interval
 - 6. Overtime



- a. If scores are tied 10minutes of overtime will be played, 5minutes each end
 - b. If the teams scores are still tied then the highest place finisher from the group stages will progress.
- ii. Grand Final
1. The Grand Final shall consist of two 20 minute halves with 5mins interval
 2. Overtime
 - a. If scores are tied 10minutes of overtime will be played, 5minutes each end.
 - b. If scores are tied after over time a “penalty shoot-out” will decide the championship with teams kicking a set shots from 30m in front of goals. Each team will take 5 shots at goal initially then sudden death as per a soccer penalty shoot out.

8.2 UMPIRES:

The Asian Championships are not only an opportunity for players but also allow the regular umpires in Asia who umpire locally each weekend to perform on a bigger stage.

Field Umpires: Each team is required to bring one field umpire for providing field umpiring duties at the tournament. A roster and further details will be provided later.

Goal and Boundary Umpires: Each team is required to provide 2 people from its squad at the beginning of each match to fulfil goal and boundary umpiring duties. This will be done on a pre-determined roster system based on the draw so it does not interfere with team preparation (see Section 8.4).

Umpire Grading: At the end of each game teams will be required to submit a grading of each field umpire to the Marshalls tent. This grading will be used in assessing which umpires will officiate in the Semi and Grand Finals.

MATCH RULES

The Asian Championships will be running the basic AFL rules, but without some of their really technical approach. The 10 points below should clarify which rules / guidelines we are using. Umpires will assume that all players will be familiar with the rules, no matter how much experience the players have.

All umpires, related marshals and team representatives will meet for a detailed briefing on Friday night (September 5th), at the Cigar Room, Oosh 830pm

GENERAL RULES (Most of these are obvious while some are for the benefit of those unaware).

Grounds will be marked with the same AFL layout but in proportion to the over all boundary size. (Boundary, Centre circle, Centre square, Goal squares, interchange gates. 50m won't be marked).

The grounds will approximately 135m x 125m which is about 83% the size of the SCG.

Teams: 16 players and up to 8 interchange players (all must be named on the particular match team sheet).

1. Hands on the back are ok for a mark contest – as long as there is no push in the back.
2. Time wasting such as deliberate out of bounds will result in free kick.
 - Not returning the ball directly to an opponent awarded a kick will result in 25m penalty.
 - An opposition player who runs through the mark – alone (i.e. not following his opponent) of player taking an awarded kick will give away a 25m penalty.
3. A warning whistle will apply if players take too long (approx 15-20 seconds) to kick in after a behind or when awarded a kick.
4. Kick in after a point will be after the goal umpire receives the “all clear” from the field umpire. Each game will have 3 footballs, 1 to be used in play and the others located in basket by the goal umpires.
5. Blood rule applies. Players must exit through interchange gate quickly (as the clock won't be stopped) when directed by umpire.
6. 25 meter penalties will apply to these smaller grounds.
7. 4 players in the square during ruck contests (standard even for these smaller grounds).
8. There will be “ruckman only” circle for centre ball-ups. Ruckmen must remain / approach from either side of the divide line as the umpire's ball up.
9. Interchange players marked on the team sheet must be in interchange area. Teams who play or interchange players **not listed** on the team sheet for that particular match will forfeit that match.



10. Captains can call for a team count of the opposition if they suspect there are too many on the field. Teams with too many players on the ground will have their scores reset to zero.

SEND OFF RULE. The send off penalty will be 10 minutes playing time. (i.e. if the player is sent off with 5 min to go in the 1st half - he can not be replaced until 5 minutes into the second half). Players sent off cannot be replaced.

Serious offence. In the case of a very serious, malicious assault incident, officials will consult and have the power to impose a ban on that player/s from the rest of the competition. Players banned for the rest of the competition can not be replaced UNTILL the next game.

Players can be sent off for the following

- Any reportable offence such as striking, unduly rough play
- Threatening behaviour (toward anyone).
- Abusive language (especially if it is audible to the spectators).

Send off procedure

1. Players sent off will proceed quickly and directly to the marshals' tent to receive a time out card.
2. They will be instructed to return to the marshals' tent with the time out card prior to being allowed back on the ground.

The time out card will have a recording of the time as it appears on that particular marshals' timer.

TIME KEEPING.

- Each game will consist of two 12 minute halves (5 minutes between each half and 5 minutes between each game).
- There will be separate time keepers available for each match (to account for any serious injury time-on delays). Ideally the aim is to have both games run synchronized so that we can keep on schedule.
- The time keeper will stop the clock **only** when instructed by the umpire, **only** in the case of serious injury or when a stretcher is requested. At this point the two games will be timed separately.

TEAM SHEETS AND COIN TOSS

During the half time break, the two captains of the next game on a pitch will meet at the marshals' tent to submit their team sheets and call the toss with the umpires. Captains please ensure your players remove any jewellery before the game.

SCORING

Goal umpires will have a score cards.

Goal umpires will cross check their cards and hand them to the scoring marshal in the marshals' tent.

RUNNERS / WATER BEARERS

Runners. Each club is allowed 1 runner to be on the ground delivering messages.

Runners must wear the identification bib provided by the marshals.

Runners must not stay on the ground for too long. If they stay on too long and get in the way, they could give away a free kick.



Water bearers Each club is allowed 3 water bearers.
Water bearers must wear the identification bib provided by the marshals.
Water bearers must not stay on the ground for too long and get in the way.

- Runners and Water bearers will not be allowed in the "50 meter area" when a set shot at goal is taking place.

FINALS

The semi finals and grand finals will be played under the same time guidelines but it will be 2 x 15 minute and 2x 20minute halves respectively.

- In the case of a drawn game, 10 minutes extra time will be allocated. Teams will swap ends and play 5 minutes each way.
- Players in the semi final will need to have played at least 1 of the preliminary games.
- Teams in the Grand Final will be able to use an unlimited playing list, thus ensuring all members of squad and suit up and train for the Grand Final.

The spirit of this rule is to ensure all members of squad can participate and be a part of the Grand Final.

Player Registration

Teams will be required to submit their squad list to the SAFC by August 18th, via the approved spreadsheet. The SAFC requires for registration and liability purposes players, full name, DOB, nationality, passport number, work permit/visa number or national ID number, Email Address, Mobile Number.

It is the Spirit of the games that players shall either reside in the country of their team or have past association with the Club. Eg It would be in the spirit of the games that if a former player of a club not residing in the Country of the team is eligible to play but it would not be in the spirit if that player had no previous association with the team.

The topic of "ring-ins" is a controversial one, the SAFC asks that teams obey by the spirit of the tournament. If there are legitimate concerns raised about a specific player The Tournament Director shall at his discretion and where possible investigate the matter.

- Jakarta Juniors

Format: Each team will play each other and the top two teams after the preliminary games will play off in the Under 16 Asian Junior Championship Grand Final as a curtain raiser to the senior Championships

Team Size: 12 a side

Game Length: The preliminary games will consist of two 12minute halves with a 4 minute interval and the Grand Final will consist of two 15 minute halves, with a 5min interval

Rules: As per the senior competition unless modified rules are agreed in advance by the Junior Tournament Director.



Auskick Carnival

There will be two Auskick sessions, the first will follow the Hurling Demonstration at 14:40 and the second session will be at half time in the Asian Champs Grand Final, which begins at 17:00.

Auskick Categories:

Under 8 – Singapore v Singapore

Under 10 – Singapore v Singapore

Under 12 – Singapore v Malaysia

Capacity exists on to use the second pitch in the afternoon for additional Auskick activities such as clinics or additional games.

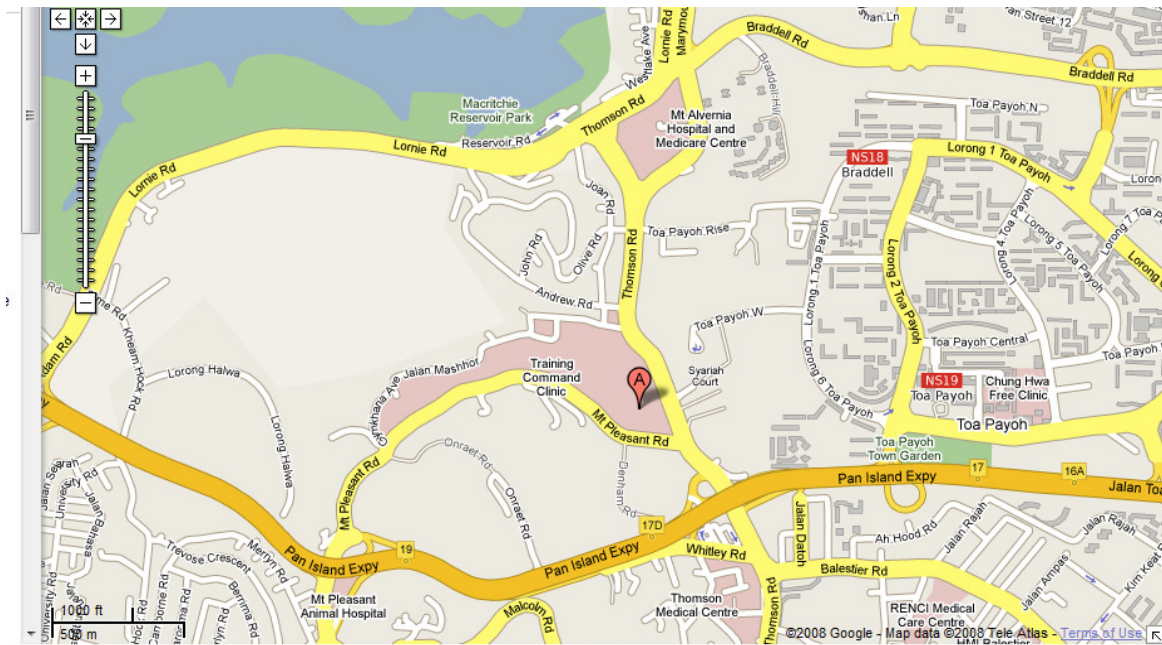
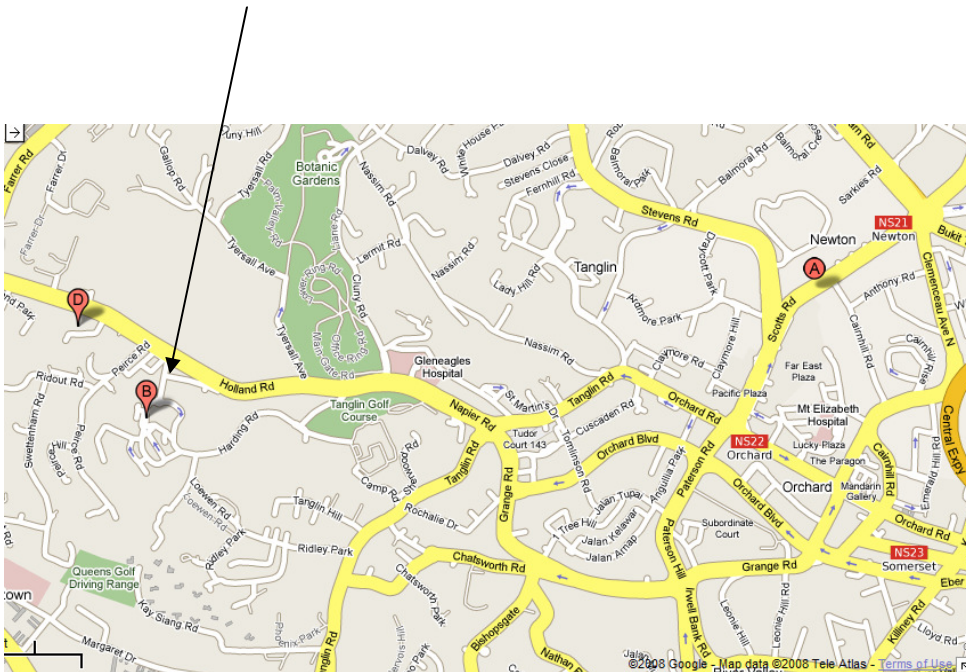




Figure 2: Oosh Pte Ltd
