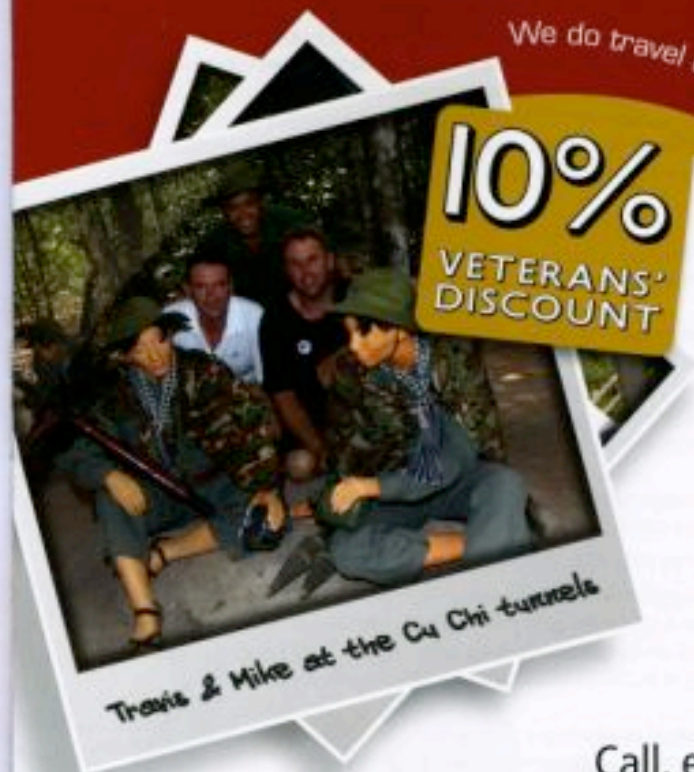

ANZAC Day and football

Last year, the Vietnam Swans were invited to play in the Thailand Tigers' 6th ANZAC Day Match in Kanchanaburi, Thailand -in front of three ex POWs. The venue of the match was 5kms from the Kanchanaburi War Cemetery; and 50kms from WWII's infamous Hellfire Pass on the Burma Death Railway.

An abridged version of the welcome address before this year's match, from National President Phil John - Vietnam Swans. In Asia on ANZAC weekend, footy matches were played, in nine countries, in memory of Australia's and New Zealand's fallen.

This year, for the first time, Vietnam hosted an ANZAC match, played between the Hanoi Hawks and Saigon Saints. Commemorating ANZAC Day in this place will have particular significance for those fortunate enough to be there, we will be reminded first hand that wars end long before the pain and suffering they cause to all involved.

The Vietnam Swans is just an Aussie Rules Club made up of ordinary people from different backgrounds who are living in an extraordinary country. We are humbled by the generosity shown to us by those who have so warmly welcomed us into their country, and we share together our sorrow and mutual respect for the sacrifices of our peoples.

While we are daunted by the prospect of hosting our first ANZAC Friendship match, we are strengthened by the knowledge that sport is a formidable force in building relationships.
