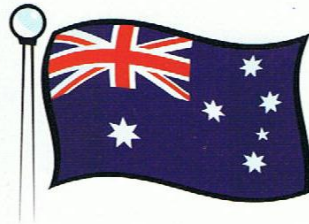

If you are looking for a trip at a very reasonable cost then think about attending the events below combined with some holidaying at a couple of the lovely resorts along the south coast of Vietnam.

(Suggestions would be Hoi An and Dalat) You can organize your own trip or go with a tour group, what ever suits.

Vung Tau is now a popular coastal resort easily accessed by a "new" Vung Tau Ferry, a hydra foil service every 2 hours from Saigon and flights to and accommodation at the resort towns can be booked over the net at surprisingly low costs.

ANZAC DAY/ WEEK COMMEMORATIONS VIET NAM

As well as the traditional services at Gallipoli, Australians take part in ANZAC Day services at some of the most significant sites in our wartime history around the world. One service that has not received a lot of press is the Dawn Service held at the Long Tan Cross memorial in Vietnam, the site of the Battle of Long Tan on 18 August 1966. Every year Australian veterans living in Vietnam organize return transport to the dawn service from Vung Tau to the rubber trees at Long Tan. Apart from the Long Tan Cross memorial there has been no development or beautification of the area and this adds to the remembrance at the site and the service.

After returning from the Long Tan service, in the afternoon many then attend a local establishment run by an Australian ex serviceman to have a few drinks, eats and watch the AFL Anzac match between Essendon and Collingwood and hopefully enjoy the Bombers having a win. There is also the opportunity for organized tours to our old base camp at Nui Dat and D445 camp locations in the Long Hai's, an area very familiar to all Vietnam Vets.

On the Saturday 21 April 2012 prior to Anzac day an AFL football match is also played on the Vung Tau oval, the same ground where servicemen competed in a very active competition during the Vietnam War.
